Thankful for the Thorn

"Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it [the thorn in his flesh] away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:7-9

Paul goes on, "Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

I marvel when I meet people like Paul. Christians who radiate the power of peace (and joy!) in the face of loss, life-threatening diseases, or persecution; It's impossible for me not to stand in awe watching the Light of Life blazing through the cracks made by their thorn. So if Christ can demonstrate His strength in my weakened flesh to reveal His face to someone in need, praise God!

At the end of the day I want to confess like Paul in Acts 20:24: 'However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me-the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace."

Heaven is my Home. Thank you Lord for gift of a thorn given at the precise time I need it to keep me on the narrow path that leads me there. Amen
